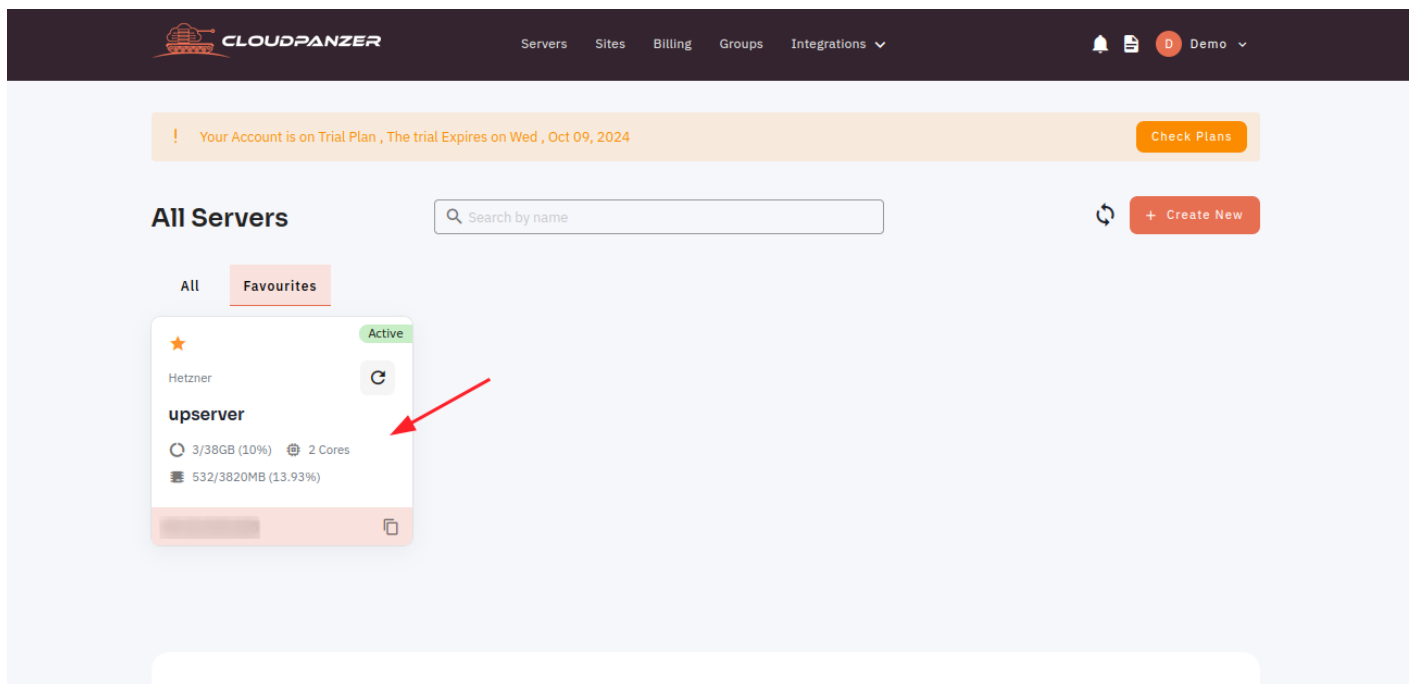


# How to Navigate Config Apache on Site?

Follow the steps below to configure Apache on the site.

1: Firstly you are logged in, look for a "Server" and click on it.



2. Click on the Site option and Select an Active Site.
